William Edward Redmon, 95, of Bloomfield, Iowa passed away on December 7, 2019 at the Bloomfield Care Center. He was born November 4, 1924 in Bloomfield, Iowa to Ben B. and Jenny Belle Smock Redmon. Bill graduated from Bloomfield High School and was a Navy pilot during WWII. On November 27, 1945, he married Betty Brooke in Iowa City. Betty passed away on May 16, 2009.

Bill worked a variety of jobs over his career but mostly in construction doing carpentry, electrical, and HVAC. His hobbies included reading, playing solitaire, and woodworking.
