Gregory Royce Brown, 57, of rural Bloomfield, Iowa passed away on April 10, 2019 at the University of Iowa Hospital Hospitals and Clinics due to complications of influenza. He was born January 23, 1962 in Ottumwa, Iowa to C. William Brown and C. Elizabeth (Brown) Brown.

He graduated from Davis County High School in 1980 and received his bachelor's degree from Iowa State University in 1987 in Hotel, Restaurant, and Institutional Management.
