Kenneth Gene Shepherd, 73, of Bloomfield, Iowa passed away January 13, 2016 at the Hospice House in Ottumwa, Iowa. He was born April 22, 1942 in Ottumwa, Iowa to Harry Irl and Lucille Mae Butler Shepherd. He married Marie Whittle on November 24, 1993 in Columbia, Missouri. Kenneth graduated from Bloomfield High School, went to work for Harris Motors in Bloomfield, and then joined the U.S. Airforce in 1961. 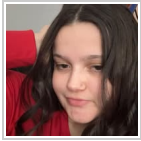

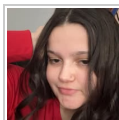
